Hello all! In our January meeting we approved the following division of Fundraiser profits amongst our various charitable projects:

Paramount High School Art Exhibition \$1,500.00 8th Grade Graduation \$ 125.00 Scholarships for Young Leaders \$8,000.00

Your Board has been wrestling with a problem regarding the cost of our monthly program meetings. Last year, for all programs, we took in \$2872.79 from the monthly \$20 charge for attendees, while we ended up with a cost of \$3355.95. This meant we had a shortfall of funds in the amount of \$483.17 which had to be supplemented from our Operations & Administration funds (which is only the membership dues allocated to our Branch – currently \$27 per member).

This year so far, with only 3 programs held, our shortfall is already at \$443.86. We know the cost of food has increased considerably over the last two years and it's not likely to decrease any time soon. And Chartwells is now charging a minimum of 20 attendees per meeting. They also charge \$45 per meeting for linens, coffee, and water. More details on the next two pages.

We've been considering various alternatives to take away this shortfall. We have already voted to cease the Speaker Stipend of \$100 per program and replace it with a Speaker Gift of an AAUW engraved tumbler. (We will, of course, honor any stipends previously promised to speakers.)

However, just ceasing the stipend will not eliminate the shortfall (that leaves us with a shortfall of -\$577.00.)

More From The Board

Among the various options proposed are:

- Increase the cost of meals to \$25, which would leave us with \$193 in Ops & Admin funds for the following year.
- Increase dues to \$30 for the Branch, which would leave us a shortfall of -\$868.00 for O&A.
- Increase dues to \$35 for the Branch, which would leave us a shortfall of -\$353.00 for O&A.
- Modify the menu, so that we have hot and/or cold Hors d'Oeuvres and/or a dessert.







Exploring History and Culture in Central Minnesota 2025 February event series launches at Sherburne History Center on February 1st

(January 8, 2025) Launching on the first Saturday in February, this year's "Exploring History and Culture in Central Minnesota" February event series features Native American history and culture. The series, which is in its sixth year, engages with the history of communities that have been and continue to be part of central Minnesota. A partnership project of the Stearns, Benton, and Sherburne County historical societies, the three central Minnesota history museums are collaborating for the 2025 series with the American Indian Center at St. Cloud State University, College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University, and Sherburne County Parks.

On Saturday, February 1st, Sherburne County Park Director, Gina Hugo, will discuss Cultural Competence Through Park Land Development-Two Inlets at Bdé Heháka-Omashkooz Zaaga'igaans Regional Park, at the Sherburne History Center in Becker. The following programs take place on Saturday, February 8th, at the Stearns History Museum in St. Cloud with Professor Ted Gordon and undergraduate research assistant Macy Ellis from CSB/SJU and on Saturday, February 15th, at the Benton County Historical Society in Sauk Rapids with the American Indian Center at SCSU. All programs start at 10:30 am and are free and open to the public.



Obituary



Most of you are aware that Lora Robinson passed away on New Years Day, as a notice was sent out to all current Branch members. Although we don't usually do this, Lora was a member for so long and contributed to our Branch in so many ways, we wanted to memorialize her.

Her daughter, Sandra Robinson, also notified our Branch directly, saying, "I am deeply saddened to inform you that my mother, Lora Robinson has passed. If you would kindly let others know, I would greatly appreciate it!" Our Membership Chair, Pat Obstarczyk, reviewed the records and found that Lora was a member for over 25 years. She was a past President of our branch, and worked in other Board positions as well.

Lora championed the cause of the AAUW Archives, which were at one time housed in her library waiting for a home. She worked closely with Janet Lore and Joanna Pucel, as they initiated the idea of moving AAUW materials out of Stearns History Museum to SCSU. The archives certainly came in handy in 2022, when we planned activities for the State AAUW convention, and honored our Branch's 100th anniversary!

In the Class Action suit Fish vs. St Cloud State University, Lora joined the Plaintiff class. Per CaseText, "In 1996, Plaintiffs filed this action alleging gender discrimination in compensation, terms and conditions of employment, and promotion and tenure. In December of 2000, the parties entered into a settlement agreement which was approved by this Court on March 26, 2001." (Fish v. St. Cloud State University, Civil No. 6:96-155, https://casetext.com/case/fish-v-st-cloud-state-university-3). Joanna Pucel called AAUW in Washington DC and told them they needed to help these women with funding for what they were doing. Funding was granted and they eventually won the lawsuit that went much further than SCSU. They received \$10,000.00 and Lora gave the money to our AAUW branch!

Lora was also a longtime member of the AAUW Afternoon Book Club, and for sure she will be missed. As Kathy Knudson-Mestnik said, "Lora was a unique, strong woman whom I admired...May she rest in peace."
