


Self Portrait

There are currently five parks in Stearns County, one in Benton County, eight parks in the St. Cloud area, and one each in Rockville, Sartell, Sauk Rapids, St. Augusta, and Rocori. 



Political Vs. Partisan

501c(3)s and Political Activity

- O The distinction between partisan and political activities is very important
 - Prohibited from directly or indirectly participating in any political campaign on behalf of (or in opposition to) any candidate for elective public office
- O Not all activities or expenditures are prohibited as long as they are conducted in a non-
- "No substantial part of the activities" of a nonprofit can be spent influencing legislation
- What is substantial?

Issues are not Partisan

- O AAUW's Mission: To advance gender equity for women and girls through research,
- AAUW's advocacy work is based on this mission
- Hyper-partisanship can lead people to draw conclusions
- O No party has a claim on any particular policy issue

FAQ's

- Can an individual make endorsements of candidates? Yes
- O Can we be involved in elections? Yes
 - Voter guides
 - Candidate forums
 - Ballot measures
 - Voter education
- Remember to include all candidates when doing outreach

Laying the Groundwork

- O Political: of, relating to, involving, or involved in politics and especially party politics
- O Partisan: a firm adherent to a party, faction, cause, or person
- Political does not mean Partisan
- Non-Partisan does not mean Indifference

So, What's Prohibited?

- Evidence of bias towards or against a particular candidate
- Direct opposition to a candidate
- O Spending a "substantial" amount of budget to influence legislation
- No contributions can be given to candidates
- O No coordination of nonpartisan work with candidates for elected office
- No coordination with organizations who have made endorsements
- Care should be taken during election years

Guidelines from National

- - Expressly advocate for or endorse any particular partisan candidate.
- Remain nonpartisan. Do not endorse candidates in partisan races.
- Work on issues guided by our values and mission, including taking positions on ballot initiatives that are in line with AAUW's Public Policy Priorities.
- Engage with candidates and elected officials from all major parties equally, making sure questions are phrased in a neutral manner.
- Encourage voter registration for everyone regardless of their political persuasion.
