We have big news to report from your Board. First of all, we had a wonderful gathering last night at the Martini Lounge. It was great to see everyone again and get ready for the upcoming AAUW season.

Get ready for a wild and crazy program season. We've fiddled with meeting dates, locations, and costs, so please pay close attention to the info - here in your Monthly Monitor, or on our website.

We are having three "field trip" programs this year:

September - Stearns History Museum

January - Great River Children's Museum

March - Judicial Speaker, 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor, Gorecki Center

For each of these field trips, we will be charging only \$10 per program. We are asking that you make your reservation before the 7-days-prior deadline, using our online system as usual. However, please make payments by mailing a check directly to Mary Harlander-Locke (730 14<sup>th</sup> Ave So. St. Cloud, MN 56301), or make payment at either the program before or after the event.

We are deep into planning for our October Fundraiser. This year's theme is "Something Magic" and we already know that you'll enjoy it tremendously. Prices are staying the same: Admission = \$74, Raffle Tickets = \$10 each or 12 for \$100. The Fall Buffet menu will be scrumptious: Maple Dijon Chicken, Roasted Red Bliss Potatoes, Roasted Asparagus, Dinner Rolls with Honey Butter, Pumpkin Mousse, and Apple Spice Cake. Yummy! Get your tickets by sending a check to Mary Harlander-Locke or paying her at the September meeting.

Our biggest announcement, which will also shortly be coming out in an email to all members, is that we are unable to run our Tech Savvy event this season. Many of our workshop presenters have been laid off, and our chief professor who coordinates rooms, student volunteers and workshops has had her workload doubled. In addition, our corporate sponsors are no longer able to assist - primarily because our contacts who have contributed so much effort in the past have gone on to take other jobs, which prevent them from helping us. We have reached out to other organizations but cannot find anyone will to pick up and organize a Tech Savvy event this year. It's very sad, but we know that things change.

As an alternative, we are considering two options:

- Create a process to give grants to Middle School teachers in the STEM fields to allow them to purchase supplies and necessary items for STEM teaching.
- 2. Create a process to provide scholarships to STEM students (similar to our process for funding Scholarships for Young Leaders.

I know this is a shocking and sad announcement, but as you can see we are looking forward to providing a replacement project, in order to continuing supporting female STEM students. Do please give us your feedback regarding these changes and let us know your thoughts.



#### 1. Funding Higher Education


- Providing fellowships and grants to women from underserved communities and underrepresented fields like STEM.
